New Lambda Beta Chapter

Northern Essex Community College Lawrence, Massachusetts

Northern Essex Community College in Lawrence, Massachusetts, established a new Lambda Beta Chapter in April, 2008. Six charter members from the Class of 2008 were inducted, along with Alumni Members from the Classes of 2007, 2006, 2005, and 2004, and two Honorary Members.

Richard Battles, RRT-NPS, CPFT and Daniel E. Coleman, MD, were recognized as Charter Honorary Members in the Northern Essex Community College Chapter of the Lambda Beta Honor Society for their sustained and multifaceted contributions to the respiratory care program at NECC. A member of the first class to graduate from the associate's degree program at the college, Richard is someone on whom we can always depend when we need support for the program – whether that support comes in the form of borrowing “just one” of a specific piece of equipment to illustrate a concept in lab, or adding “just one” more student to a clinical group or finding an alternate schedule for that “just one” student who needs special consideration. Richard is an active member of the NECC Respiratory Care Program Advisory Committee.

Richard has dedicated his professional life to the patients at Lawrence General Hospital, where he has practiced the art and science of respiratory care for more than 36 years. Today he serves as the Director of Respiratory Therapy and EEG Services at Lawrence General. His leadership and the standards for practice that are set in the Respiratory Care Department at Lawrence General Hospital rival those in our major academic medical centers. In addition, he is the owner and operator of Pulmonary Technology Services, which is a consultant service that organizes and operates pulmonary laboratories.

In addition to his associate's degree in Respiratory Therapy from Northern Essex, Richard holds a certificate in Respiratory Therapy from Northeastern University and Tufts University School of Medicine.

Dr. Coleman is a critical care physician and vice president for medical affairs at Caritas Holy Family Hospital in Methuen, MA, as well as a pulmonary and critical care physician at Lawrence General Hospital. Dr. Coleman received his undergraduate

education at Boston University; his medical degree from Georgetown University School of Medicine, and completed military training at the Air War College in 1999. In addition, Dr. Coleman holds the rank of Colonel and Senior Flight Surgeon with the Massachusetts Air National Guard where he is recognized as an expert in the medical aspects of biological warfare and bioterrorism.

Dr. Coleman is the medical director for the Respiratory Care program at Northern Essex Community College. Scholarships Available in 2009

The Lambda Beta Society is pleased to announce that the following awards will be offered in 2009. Information will be sent to all programs with active Lambda Beta Chapters as well as being posted to our website at www.nbrc.org/lambda. All the scholarships described below will be presented on Saturday, December 5, 2009 in San Antonio, Texas in conjunction with the 55th AARC International Congress at the annual Lambda Beta Reception.

Gerald K. Dolan Memorial Scholarship

Gerald Dolan was a dedicated respiratory care educator, mentor, and leader in our profession. In his memory, a new scholarship will be presented in 2009 to a student enrolled in a baccalaureate or masters level program in respiratory care.

To be eligible, students must be enrolled in good standing in a college or university with an active Lambda Beta Society Chapter, must be in the top 25% of the respiratory class with a minimum GPA of 3.0, must conduct and submit an independent, original literature review relevant to respiratory care, and must comply with the scholarship application requirements and deadline.

Deshpande-Pilbeam Media Award

In its second year, this award is presented on the merits of an original, independent media presentation relevant to respira-

tory care and must comply with the application requirements and deadline.

To be eligible, applicants must (1) be enrolled in good standing in an approved respiratory care program with an active Lambda Beta Society Chapter or (2) have graduated in 2009 from an approved respiratory care program with an active Lambda Beta Chapter.

AMP Scholarship, Lambda Beta Scholarship, Thomas and Kim Hill Scholarship

These awards are open to students enrolled in an approved, entry level or an approved, advanced level respiratory care program based at a community college, college, or university. To be eligible, students must be enrolled in good standing in a college or university with an active Lambda Beta Society Chapter, must be in the top 25% of the respiratory class with a minimum GPA of 3.0, and must conduct and submit an independent, original literature review in compliance with the award guidelines and deadline.

Hints from the Scholarship Committee

I've had the privilege of serving on the Scholarship Committee for the Lambda Beta Society for the past several years. After our committee members noticed patterns of errors among the applications, we met in December 2008 to determine how to assist future applicants enhance their chances for winning our awards and scholarships.

On behalf of the committee, I'm offering the following recommendations to individuals considering applying for the 2009 Lambda Beta awards:

1. Review and comply with the requirements for the scholarships and/or media award.
 - Use the stated font and format for your literature review or presentation summary.
 - Keep your media entry within the stated number of slides or your paper within the stated length. Use the Notes Page to offer detailed explanation of your slide content.

- Cite your references according to one of the approved formats.
2. Comply with application deadline.
 - Submit your entry and the required application materials prior to the October 1, 2009 deadline.
 3. Use the expert resources at your college or university.
 - Utilize the library resources for assistance on conducting literature reviews.

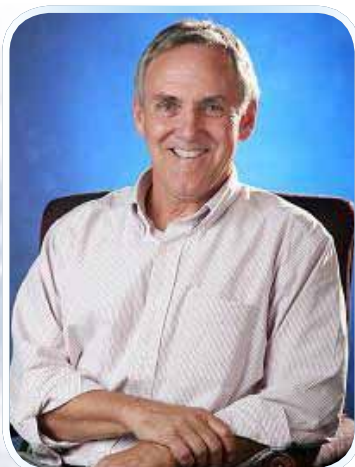

- Consult the writing center for guidance in writing literature reviews.
- Utilize the technology center for assistance with creating a PowerPoint® presentation.
- Request feedback on your literature review or media presentation from your program faculty or community experts.
- 4. Maintain anonymity within the body of your paper or presentation.
 - Use the unique identifier (last four digits of your social security number) on the body of your literature review and/or your cover slide. Do not include photos, logos, or any identifiers within the body of your paper or presentation that would identify your college or university. (After the Executive Office verifies compliance with deadlines and receipt of required application materials, the committee receives just the papers and presentations which are only labeled with unique identifiers. The committee remains unaware of the identity of the applicants and only is informed of the names of the scholarship and media award recipients when the winners are notified.)
