Palm Beach State College Respiratory Care Program

Palm Beach State College (PBSC) was founded during the Great Depression in 1933 and will soon be celebrating its 90th anniversary. The college has a long-standing history of serving the educational needs of Palm Beach County residents and offers bachelor's and associate's degrees, professional certificates, workforce development, in addition to lifelong learning. PBSC has grown to become one of the largest institutions of higher education in Palm Beach County, currently serving more than 40,000 students annually. The college has five campus locations in addition to online learning. In 2015, the college hired its first female president, Ava L. Parker, J.D.



The respiratory care program was established in 1989 with the collaboration of seven county hospitals who agreed to provide funding and support. Today, the program proudly has thirteen hospital business partnerships, known as the Business Partnership Council (BPC), who continue to support and participate in student education. In addition to providing clinical education and preceptorship, the BPC jointly participates in our annual mock interview panel to prepare students for employment success along with offering guest lectures on various topics. Besides the AS program in respiratory care, PBSC now offers a Bachelor of Science in Cardiopulmonary Sciences degree with the first class convening in August of 2020, during the height of the COVID-19 pandemic. This program is 100% online and is currently gathering data to apply for the Commission on Accreditation for Respiratory Care (CoARC) accreditation.

The respiratory care program's Lambda Beta Honor Society chapter was established in January 2008 with the goal of acknowledging the hard work and professional dedication of the cohort's top 25%. In addition to their studies, students participate in community service at the college and in the community. Events include the college COVID-19 task force, community health fairs, job fairs, providing asthma education with the American Lung Association, Relay for Life, Heart Walk, club rush, attending the AARC Congress, and state sputum bowl competitions. Our students have received numerous college scholarships and awards along with one recipient of the Florida Society for Respiratory Care Dr. Ethel E. Johnson Memorial Scholarship Award.

We currently have over 60 Lambda Beta Honor Society members and the recipients are celebrated along with other graduates during our annual pinning ceremony and luncheon with our first-year students, the BPC and college administration. I have served on the board for the Lambda Beta honor society since 2019. I am currently the president-elect and looking forward to my continued service to the society and the students in which we serve.





Meet Dr. Randy Case

Randy Case, PhD, RRT-NPS, is an Assistant Professor in Respiratory Care and the Director of Interdisciplinary Education for the Health Sciences and Human Services College at Midwestern State University (MSU) in Wichita Falls, Texas. He received his Bachelor of Science in Respiratory Care from MSU in 2000, the year he was inducted into the Lambda Beta Honor Society. Dr. Case went on to obtain his Masters in Health Care Administration from Wayland Baptist University in 2012 and his PhD in Educational Leadership from the University of the Cumberlands in 2018.

Randy has been a Respiratory Therapist for over 20 years, most of which was spent specializing in pediatric and neonatal intensive care. Randy shifted his career path to focus on the educational components of respiratory care in 2013, which led him back to his alma mater, MSU. Within the classroom, Dr. Case's teaching philosophy is grounded on the basis that regardless of the type of personality, learning style, or level of pre-existing knowledge, each student can master a practical understanding of any concept through motivation, engagement, collaboration, enthusiasm, encouragement, support, and innovative teaching strategies. His fundamental objective in teaching the future generations of respiratory therapists is to develop genuine patient-care skills and a strong work ethic among his students.

Randy's research interests include interdisciplinary healthcare education development and simulation implementation among the health sciences.

2022 NATIONAL HONORARY MEMBER

Kathy Jones-Boggs Rye, EdD, RRT, RRT-NPS, RRT-ACCS, FAARC



Kathy received her Bachelor of Science Degree in Cardiopulmonary Sciences from Louisiana State University in 1986. She continued her education at the University of Arkansas with a Master's Degree in Education in 1996 and a Doctoral Degree in Higher Education in 2001. Kathy is a registered respiratory therapist, adult critical care specialist and neonatal pediatric specialist.

Kathy's professional experiences scanned all phases of respiratory care as she served as a staff therapist, a supervisor and later served in the academic world as an instructor and director of clinical education. Her tenure at the University of Arkansas's Respiratory Care Program demonstrated continuous academic growth from instructor to assistant professor to associate professor and culminated in being conferred Professor Emeritus in 2012.

Kathy's curriculum vitae is replete with numerous citations of scholarship. She presented at over one hundred state and local conferences and is a persistent and valued presenter at the AARC Summer Forum and International Congress dating back to 1996. She has numerous publications and provides continuing education programs, which are particularly valuable in assisting the Commission on Accreditation for Respiratory Care (CoARC) and the respiratory care community in the areas of clinical preceptor training and development and inter-rater reliability.

Leadership and service are hallmarks of Kathy's professional career and of note is her service to the Arkansas Society for Respiratory Care (ASRC) as Delegate in the AARC House of Delegates, as well as vice president, president-elect and president for the ASRC. At the national level she was inducted in the 2009 Class of Fellows of the American Association for Respiratory Care (FAARC), awarded the Ikaria Best First Author Literary Award presented by the American Respiratory Care Foundation (ARCF), awarded Education Section Practitioner of the Year in 2008, presented with the Lifetime Achievement Award for Dedicated Service to Respiratory from the ASRC in 2012, and recognized as the 2017 Bonner Smith Outstanding Service Award presented by CoARC. Kathy was appointed to CoARC in 2008 and has served on virtually every committee, as well as secretary from 2009-2011, president-elect from 2011-2013, president from 2013-2015, and immediate past president from 2015-2017.

As a respiratory therapist, Kathy has a very unique experience because she was a respiratory patient herself on a ventilator for 46 days. She fully understands the feelings and trauma as a patient. Kathy experienced the vital role of respiratory therapists in the care of critically-ill patients. She has not slowed down in retirement, maintaining a voice on CoARC, accomplishing site visits, and leading respiratory discussions throughout the US as a lecturer and facilitator for Kettering. One of her most recent contributions highlights her enthusiasm and passion for respiratory care, published in the widely read journal, CHEST.

Kathy is well-regarded for her knowledge and skill in the area of Clinical Preceptor Training (CPT), developing one of the earliest and most effective programs at the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences in Little Rock. She has become a highly-sought speaker and consultant in this subject, providing guidance to many programs and educators across the country as they seek to improve their own CPT programs and meet accreditation standards.

I am very honored to have been selected to receive this most prestigious award. It is a privilege to be recognized among the distinguished ranks of the past honorees, all of whom have made such important contributions to the respiratory care profession. It matters a lot to be recognized for making even a small difference in some way to this profession that I dearly love and that has made such a difference in my own life.

Remembering Brad Leidich, MEd, RRT, FAARC An Outstanding Educator, Leader and Mentor

The profession of respiratory care is saddened by the passing of Brad Leidich, MEd, RRT, FAARC, (1948-2022) on June 14, 2022. Brad's accomplishments and contributions as a leader and an educator were exemplary. He was particularly concerned about the quality of education, the success of the students, the direction of the profession, and the succession planning for future educators and leaders. He was a great mentor to many of us - his colleagues, students, faculty, friends, and other individuals.

Brad's dedication to our profession has been reflected by his active involvement in different roles in several organizations. He served his home state from 1981 until 2007 in various positions including president of the Pennsylvania Society for Respiratory Care. He retired in 2012 as a senior professor emeritus from Harrisburg Area Community College, where he served as program director of respiratory therapy, and later as the department chair of allied health and human services.

His service to the American Association for Respiratory Care (AARC) was the longest in his career which spanned for five decades, 1972-2022. He participated in many committees of the AARC, including the Taskforce on Competencies for Entry Level into Respiratory Care Practice, the House of Delegates, etc. He received the prestigious award as a Fellow of the AARC (FAARC) in 2007.

Although Brad retired in 2012 from the community college, he continued to support the Commission on Accreditation for Respiratory Care (CoARC), where he was a four-term commissioner, a site visitor since 1989, a president-elect (2013-2015), president (2015-2017), and immediate past president (2017-2019), along with other positions. He received the Dr. Ralph Kendall, MD Outstanding Site Visitor Award in 2019 and the Bonner Smith Outstanding Service Award in 2020.

The Lambda Beta Society recognized Professor Brad Leidich as the National Honorary Member in October 2016. This honor is reserved for an individual who has made an outstanding contribution nationally to the progress and/or development of the art, science, literature, or public understanding of respiratory care.

The Lambda Beta Society has formed a subcommittee chaired by Dr. Henry Oh to develop the Brad Leidich Memorial Scholarship. Vicki Gentzel and many others have donated to make this scholarship possible this year and in future years. This year the scholarship was awarded to Michelle Bartholomeo, a first-generation college student at Harrisburg Area Community College pursuing an associate's degree. This scholarship will be offered annually with our H. Frederic Helmholtz, Jr., MD Scholarship, NBRC Leadership Award and CoARC Stephen P. Mikles, EdD, RRT, FAARC Media Award.

HENRY OH PRESENTS AT INTERNATIONAL AND NATIONAL SCIENTIFIC MEETINGS

Henry Oh, PhD, RRT, RRT-NPS, FACSc, FRSB, FAPSR, who is the immediate past president of Lambda Beta Society, presented at the International Congress of Nursing, Biochemistry and Pharmacy (Congreso Internacional Multidisciplinario de Las Carreras de Enfermería, Bioquímica Y Farmacia) in South America April 27-28. The event was hosted by the Universidad de Aquino in Bolivia, the largest private university with nearly 40,000 students. The university has a college of medicine and a state-of-the-art digitized Martin Dockweiler University Hospital. Dr. Oh was one of the international speakers invited to participate in this event where he represented North America. He delivered his topic on “Respiratory Care of Patients with COVID-19 Infection” in several campus locations of the university. He translated and delivered his presentations in Spanish.

Dr. Oh also presented at the 143rd National Annual Meeting of the Association of Clinical Scientists (ACS) in Kentucky, which was sponsored by the University of Louisville May 11-14. Dr. Oh was among the 44 speakers who presented with his topic on “Respiratory Pathology of Acute Respiratory Distress Syndrome.” The abstract of his presentation has been published in the Annals of Clinical and Laboratory Science, a peer-reviewed scientific and clinical research journal. He serves as the editor of the Clinical Science Trumpet, the official newsletter publication of ACS and is a Fellow of the ACS (FACSc). Fellows are doctoral scientists who are experts in the education of and/or application of laboratory methods for elucidation, diagnosis, and treatment of human diseases.
